Reuse Gift Wrap

When it is time to package your gifts, use what you already have. Newspaper comics, paper shopping bags, and even scratch computer paper make great alternatives to gift wrap. You can use stamps or children's artwork to decorate. Fall leaves, shells, and even trimmings from your holiday tree can be used to give your gift the perfect touch. You can also create a two-in-one gift by using a reusable shopping bag to store your gift or wrapping the gift with a scarf.



Do it Yourself Décor

The best part about the holidays are the decorations. Repurpose decorations from previous years or create a decoration swap with friends

and family. Get crafty with newspaper to make recycled snowflakes, or upcycle items such as glass bottles, buttons, or extra fabric to create your own holiday ornaments, wreathes, and table décor.
