Workshops

- A. All Read One Book: Hope, Faith & a Corpse (Dee Hoff) It is suggested that you read Hope, Faith, & a Corpse_by Laura Jensen Walker prior to attending. We will discuss the formation of book discussion groups, choosing book titles, researching information to aid in leading the discussion, and the format of the discussion itself. Interspersed will be the discussion of the book we have read.
- B. Collection Development Policy (Ann Pool & Ann Johnson) How do you decide what to include in your library? How do you handle complaints and challenged books? In this workshop we'll talk about why a collection policy is important and how to develop one.
- C. LibraryThing Basics (Jackie Huffman) This workshop will be an excellent opportunity to learn more about the free internet resource called LibraryThing. New or experienced users will learn about its benefits and pick up some tips on how to use it.
- D. Reuniting the Sinner with His Sin: Who Better than a Clerical Detective (Al Moser) Every mystery writer wants a detective with a distinctive trait. Detectives with some sort of clerical credentials are a sub-genre and of interest to church librarians. We will survey a good number of clerical detectives and invite participants to champion their own favorites.
- E. Believers & Bookworms: A Match Made in Heaven (How the reading life can expand our faith life) (Christina Dudley) In a world of screens, what place do books have? How can we encourage reading and love of reading in our congregations? How can books draw us closer to God and each other?
- F. Seeking Christ Through Friendship (Jan Alkire)
 Many people long to share their spiritual journey with
 others. This workshop will explore the basics of how
 to have life-giving friendships that include Jesus as a
 third, very important friend. It will look at essentials
 such as listening, confidentiality, praying together,
 and more.
- G. The Bible's Plot: Connecting the Bible's Story to Your Story (Ken Onstot) Most of us experience the Bible in bits and pieces: a memory verse, a Sunday School Bible story, a short text for a sermon or devotion, etc. But viewed more broadly, the Bible has an overarching plot with subplots that reveal the pattern of God's work in the World. Step back and begin to see the fingerprints of God's work.
