FALL COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Bible Course: "Hearing the Spirit with God's People Past and Present"

In two 4-week sessions, we will explore together stories of people's experience of God and through these stories enliven our imaginations about how God's Spirit works through unlikely characters to bring about God's good purpose for God's people and the world.

These first two retreats are geared toward experiencing and understanding community formation as God's people and in the Holy Spirit. From our common experiences of being in community, we want to explore with greater intentionality the dynamics of community formation. Through action-reflection models of learning, we will practice resilience, and hospitality as ways to embrace our unique differences and callings in God.

If you've read some anti-racist books, and are looking for next steps as an individual, family or congregation, this course offers additional ways to move forward.
