Paying for Camp—Financial Aid and Camper Fundraising

Paying your full camp fee, plus voluntarily donating the "Living with Diabetes Scholarship" portion, covers the full cost for your child. You can receive a tax receipt for your donation.

- **Diabetes WALK** *for Camp Seale Harris*—When your team walks in honor of your favorite camper, all donations raised support your camp fees and "Living with Diabetes Scholarship." Walk live, or online, and support camp. Register now to be ready for camp at campsealeharris.org/diabetes-walk.
- **Employer Scholarship**—Many employers cover diabetes camp fees for employee children. Ask our office for assistance.
- Financial Need Scholarship—Income-based scholarships are available by application. A \$25 camp registration deposit is required to have your application considered. All camp registration is online at campsealeharris.org. Scholarships are based on Federal Poverty Level Income Guidelines. Call for an application or download from our website. Applicants are encouraged to participate in the Diabetes WALK or camper fundraising.
- "Camp Champion" Camper Fundraising—Kids raise money for camp fees online or through mail. Participants receive recognition and prizes at camp.
- Sponsor Request Packet—Many sponsors from your community, such as individuals, churches, civic organizations, and businesses, will help at your request. Sponsorship opportunities do not require a financial aid application and often involve only your phone call or request letter. A sponsor request packet can be mailed to you and is also located on our website.
- Payment Plan—Weekly or monthly payments are available to fit your family's need.
