Before the Liturgy starts, enjoy some quiet time. A traditional prayer of intention is noted below (from St Augustine's Prayerbook, 1947, Order of the Holy Cross) which you may find spiritually helpful if time allows.

Additionally, Psalm 43 (BCP p. 394) is a good psalm to read before mass.

THE MASS

The Mass is the Church's obedient response to the solemn command of the Saviour at the Last Supper: Do this in remembrance of me. By this command, Christ gave to his Church a means of uniting himself to him in offering to the Father his sacrifice of perfect human obedience through death. In baptism, the Christian has become a part of the Risen Christ – one of the New Race in Christ, a member of the Royal Priesthood in him – and as Christians obediently merge themselves into his sacrificial offering of Christ, they raise to the Father that praise and thanksgiving which are his due from creation. To effect this action a variety of rites has developed in the Church, and the service in the Book of Common Prayer is the rite provided by the American Church for its performance. As it is used by Priest and People together, the Glorified Christ offers his sacrifice to the Father in the midst of the life of the world.

5. To ask thee to bless all my friends and relations, especially_____
6. For the dead, especially_____

Bless the Priest who is to preside at this oblation. Bless all the people who are here to participate in this glorious action, and all who would like to be here. Convert all sinners. Heal the anguish of the world. And have merc upon all the faithful departed.

O God accept all my prayers during this holy service of our bounden duty, for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.



And to all thy People give thy heavenly grace; and especially to this congregation here present; that, with meek heart and due reverence, they may hear, and receive thy holy Word; truly serving thee in holiness and righteousness all the days of their life. AND we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us; and, of thy almighty goodness, vouchsafe to bless and sanctify, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, these thy gifts and creatures of bread and wine; that we, receiving them according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood.

Shield: Argent on a Cross Gules a Sword erect also Argent hilted and enflamed Or, on a canton azure, a key and crozier argent in saltire, in Sinister Base a Windmill Brunâtre

Supporters: Two beaver rampant, armed and languant, Brunâtre

Compartment: A grassy ground vert speckled with Thistles and Roses on a Seascape Argent and Azure

The basis of the escutcheon is the Cross of St George. You see this in the Union Jack and the Naval Ensign of England. And the Flag of the Dioceses of the Church of England – each uniquely differenced. As well the provinces of the Anglican Communion. Impaled on the Cross is the flaming sword of St Michael. The Episcopal Church, from which the Anglican Catholic Church in America descends, has a blue field in Quarter 1 with the Saltire of 9 crosslets representing the original 9 dioceses. The ACC has replaced that with the Key and Crozier. In Quarter 4 you find a Windmill for New Amsterdam/New York. The shield, as the church, is supported by Old New York represented by the two beavers (rampant – up on their hind legs ready to go) armed (claws out) and languant (mouth open as if growling – or whatever menacing sound a beaver makes when being protective). It is resting on the green earth of land set in the sea with roses and thistles – the island of Manhattan with its Dutch, English, and Scottish heritage visible.

This is our foundation. YOU are our future.
