Gov. Ricketts Proclaims Statewide Day of Prayer, First Lady Urges Nebraskans to Volunteer

LINCOLN – Governor Pete Ricketts has signed a proclamation declaring Sunday, April 7, 2019 as a Statewide Day of Prayer for Nebraskans affected by the flooding and disastrous conditions throughout the state.

"Nebraska has experienced the most widespread natural disaster in state history," said Governor Ricketts. "The unprecedented flooding and severe weather have led 81 of our 93 counties to issue disaster declarations.

"This coming Sunday, we are asking Nebraska to lift our state up in prayer. As Nebraskans roll up our sleeves and work together on recovery efforts, we ask God for wisdom in seeing and best responding to the needs around us," the Governor remarked. "By the grace of God, Nebraska's communities will emerge from this challenge stronger and better than ever."

"The devastating floods across the state have left many of our friends and neighbors in need of assistance," said First Lady Susanne Shore. "Because Nebraskans are some of the most caring and compassionate people in the world, those not directly impacted by the floods are eager to help.
