Nelson Mandela, on his 89th birthday, convened *The Elders* --- other global leaders like Jimmy Carter, Mary Robinson, Desmond Tutu and Kofi Annan --- “to support courage where there is fear, foster agreement where there is conflict, and inspire hope where there is despair.”

Mahan, along with a few other elders, asked the question: “Why not in Asheville, our community?” He will share about this experiment along with the more general question --- can becoming an elder for justice be a narrative to embody in aging?
