Jonathan Maresca is an Episcopal seminarian pursuing his Masters of Divinity at Yale Divinity School. Before beginning his studies at Yale, Jonathan worked in faith-based advocacy at Sojourners in Washington, D.C. Jonathan's spiritual formation has largely centered through his time in traditional and emergent Benedictine monasteries. Jonathan has held and curated emergent contemplative spaces, based on the ancient practices of contemplative Christianity, to meet a younger generation's longing to belong. Katie holds a Master of Theological Studies from Harvard Divinity School, and now lives in Erie, PA with the Benedictine Sisters in a small intentional community called the Pax Priory, a site of monastic tradition and experimentation.
