Scholarships

Act Six Twin Cities Scholarship Program- An initiative of Urban Ventures, Act Six is Minneapolis-St. Paul's only **full-tuition, full-need** urban leadership award. For Fall 2017, Act Six will select between 30-40 of the Twin Cities' most promising urban leaders for scholarships to five partner colleges: Augsburg University, Bethany Lutheran College, Bethel University, North Central University and University of Northwestern (**Deadline 11/7/2017**).

American College Foundation- Applicant must be currently enrolled as a High School Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, or Senior (2021, 2020, 2019, or 2018); and, must be a United States citizen or eligible non-citizen. **Financial need is NOT considered; all income levels are encouraged to apply.** Awards range from \$1,000 to \$5,000 each; with multiple winners to be selected. Each award is a non-renewable, one-time award and is to be used exclusively to offset costs and fees related directly to the student's first year of higher post-secondary education at an accredited institution of the student's choosing within the United States. All applications for the American College Foundation's Visionary Scholarship Program will consist of: a completed American College Foundation Visionary Scholarship Application, high school transcript and a 500-word, typed, double-spaced essay on "Why College is Important to Me" (**Deadline 5/1/2017**).

AXA Achievement Scholarship- Applicants to the AXA Achievement Scholarship must be United States citizens or legal residents living or claiming residency in one of the 50 united states, Washington, D.C. or Puerto Rico, be current high school seniors who plan to enroll full-time in an accredited two-year or four-year college or university in the United States for the entire 2018-2019 academic year and demonstrate ambition and self-drive as evidenced by outstanding achievement in school, community or work-related activities. Students have the opportunity to receive a \$2,500, \$10,000 or \$25,000 scholarship. In addition, for every student who wins a scholarship, a grant in the amount of \$1,000 will be made to the winner's school (**Deadline 12/15/2017**).

The Better Business Bureau (BBB) Student of Integrity Scholarship- These scholarships are designed to recognize and promote ethics and integrity among young people. BBB will award scholarships to graduating high school senior students who personify all of the best aspects of high character in their personal choices and actions. Scholarship money is awarded directly toward winners' post-secondary education expenses (tuition or room/board only) at any accredited institution. This is a one-time, non-renewable scholarship. Recipients are selected primarily upon the basis of a written essay or video entry (**Deadline 9/21/2017**).

Hispanic Heritage Youth Awards- the Youth Awards honor Latino high school seniors who excel in the classroom and community. Eligibility: must be graduating in the Spring of 2018, 3.0 GPA, be of Hispanic Heritage including (includes Spain, Brazil, Philippines) planning to enroll full-time in a bachelor's degree program directly after your graduation from high school and be a Permanent Resident, DACA, U.S. Citizen or Eligible Non-Citizen. **If selected, attendance to the regional ceremony is mandatory. Travel to the ceremony will be at the recipient's expense.** Students must complete an online application including a letter of recommendation, transcript and essay questions (**Deadline 10/2/2017**).

Horatio Alger Minnesota Scholarship Program- The total value of this award is \$10,000 paid out in installments annually. Eligibility: must attend high school in an eligible county in Minnesota, must be a resident of Minnesota, must be a U.S. citizen, must be enrolled as a full-time high school senior, progressing normally toward graduation, and planning to enter college no later than the fall semester following graduation, must demonstrate a critical financial need. (\$55,000 or less adjusted gross income per family is preferred; a written explanation must be provided if income is higher) and must have a grade point average of 2.0 or higher (**Deadline 10/25/2017**).
