## **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)/MN Dream Act- Available October 1st**

Students can file their 2017-2018 FAFSA/MN Dream Act application as early as October 1, 2016, three months earlier than the traditional January 1<sup>st</sup> date. To file the 2017-2018 FAFSA/MN Dream Act application students will be required to report income and tax information from an earlier tax year. For the 2017-2018, students and parents will report your 2015 income and tax information, rather than 2016 information. This change will give students and their families more time to explore and understand their financial aid options.

To apply, visit [fafsa.gov](http://fafsa.gov) to file a FAFSA or [here](#) to file a MN Dream Act application. Before you begin, it is helpful to gather the following information and documents:

- Student and parent(s) social security numbers or 1-94s (if applicable)
- Student and parent(s) dates of birth
- Student and parent(s) total amount in checking, savings and cash
- Parent(s) date married, separated or divorced
- Student and parent(s) 2015 federal income tax return
- Student and parent(s) 2015 W-2 forms

**Beat the Odds Scholarship Program**- The Beat the Odds scholarship program honors outstanding high school students who have overcome tremendous adversity in life to achieve academic excellence, demonstrate leadership in their communities and aspire to attend college. Each year Children's Defense Fund-Minnesota selects five of the most deserving Twin Cities-area high school students for a Beat the Odds scholarship to be put toward college expenses. **Horatio Alger Minnesota Scholarship Program**- Minnesota Horatio Alger Endowment Fund is funding \$ 10,000 to ten winners this year. To be eligible to apply for a Horatio Alger State Scholarship, applicants must be a high school senior with plans to enter a college no later than the fall following graduation, exhibit a strong commitment to pursue and complete a bachelor's degree at (students may start their studies at a two-year institution and then transfer to a four-year institution) demonstrate critical financial need (\$55,000 or lower adjusted gross family income is required), be involved in co-curricular and community service activities, display integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity, maintain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 and be a United States citizen. **Act Six Twin Cities Scholarship**- An initiative of Urban Ventures, Act Six is Minneapolis-St. Paul's only **full-tuition, full-need** urban leadership award.
