



Warm winter rains have melted the deep snow here in this high valley of the Siskiyou Mountains of Southern Oregon. The earth is sodden, and the creek rushes along to the sea. Birds rejoice at the uncovering of the soil, giving them renewed access to the seedbank as well as worms and other small creatures of the foodweb—even though there is not a dry twig to be had for a comfortable perch! In the midst of the snowstorm, several birds came to live inside our heated greenhouse, amusing me with their flitting antics, perfectly comfortable it seemed, well-fed somehow. I'm glad they have now found other accomodations—halfdomesticated birds and germinating seeds do not mix, or should I say they mix too well? Outside my window, I am amused by a gray squirrel newly emerged from her nutty slumbers within the barky bole of a big leaf maple tree. She is leaping with abandon between the smooth trunks of two giant alders. Back and forth she goes, nearly manic, tired of resting. Like the squirrel, I too am sufficiently rested by weeks of involuntary cabin time, and yearn to be in the garden, excercising my ancient right to prepare the seedbed, sow the seed, nurture nature and simultaneously diversify diet. In anticipation, I break out the most respected seeds of spring, beginning to plant in the greenhouse the herbaceous medicinals (motherwort, elecampane and hyssop). Trusted friends all. Peas and spinach will be sown outdoors as soon as the soil dries out a bit. I'm planting plenty of trees from seed, too. The seeds I sow are the same ones found in this unique seed catalog you are holding in your hands right now. You will find herein old friends to sustain, and over 50 new species to delight. In the tree section alone, I see many that are new to this catalog: Acacia, African Sausage Tree, Desert Fan Palm, Ethiopian Coffee, Joshua Tree, Ocotillo, Soursop, Wintersweet, Yellow Wood...

This year has been one of renewal—the republishing of new improved editions of both "Making Plant Medicine" and "Growing At-Risk Medicinal Herbs" has been a labor of love, and a new website at strictlymedicinalseeds.com has made all our offerings more readily available to you internet-savvy gardeners. If the seeds are planted in a reasonable environment and don't germinate, then we will replace the packet (one-time replacement only, offer valid for one year after purchase). Bulk Seed Purchases, Plants, Rootstock: Because of our lack of control over cultivation practices and weather conditions, we are not able to give any guarantee on bulk seed sales (ie. gram, 10 grams, 100 grams, and pounds), plants, or rootstock. Therefore, we will not replace bulk seeds, plants, or rootstock or give cash refunds. We are not responsible for losses incurred through the failure of any crop derived from our seeds, plants, or rootstock. Seeds Backorder Policy: Many seeds are viable for a short period only and are best delivered in season. If these are ordered out of season, they will be backordered and delivered from the new crop. (No additional shipping will be charged.) For best results, sow seeds immediately upon receipt.







We find the Elderberry glycerite to be an excellent preventative and treatment for colds and flu. Universally accepted good taste and effectiveness. School children thrive.

#### **Combine:**

100 g dried Black Elderberries (see page 10 of this catalog)

300 ml vegetable glycerin

200 ml clean water

Whip this up in a blender until smooth, macerate and shake for 2 weeks, then pour the mass into a pressing bag and press with the above tincture press. Yield 16 ounces of high potency Elderberry glycerite.

Band compost or composted manure below the furrow before direct-seeding in the early spring. Do a patch of at least 3 rows to assure pollination. Try to avoid cloudy and rainy conditions. Sow after the soil has truly warmed up. Thin to 6 inches apart. Cultivate often and hill up.

Corn, Black Aztec . . . . . Zea mays (Flour Corn, Grinding Corn, Mexican Corn, Sweet Black Corn, Mexican Sweet)

75 days to maturity. Stalks 5 to 6 feet tall, 2 ears per stalk. This is probably the darkest of corn cultivars, with kernels deep purple to black. There is nothing like growing your own cornbread, a profoundly grounding experience. When we made our harvest (a bit too early) a number of ears turned out to be immature (soft white kernels), and these we sliced from the cob, slow boiled and ate for breakfast as corn porridge. It was absolutely wonderful!

Onions prefer a full sun position, frequent watering, good garden soil, and assiduous weeding. Sow in flats in the greenhouse and keep cutting back the tops to encourage bulbing, then transplant. Or, direct seed by planting closely together in the furrow. Eat the thinnings, leaving the largest plants to mature out at 4 inches between.

**Chives, English** . . Allium schoenoprasum Bulbous, clumping monocot cultivated worldwide and hardy to 0° F. This is the smallest of the edible Onions, valued for its tasty green leaves (scapes) and flower buds. A tasty garnish.

**Arhat Fruit** . . . . . Momordica grosvenorii Herbaceous perennial dioecious vine native to the mountain forests of southwestern China. Hardy to about 20° F. Rare in the western world, and among collectors, a desired species. After a year's growth, our plants produced a handsome caudex, each giving rise to several sturdy vines. # Senna, Wild ....... Cassia marilandica <<< NEW FOR 2017 >>>

Family: Legume (Fabaceae)

Herbaceous perennial to 4 feet, hardy to -30° F, featuring dark green compound leaves and gobs of bright yellow flowers. Native to the Eastern and Southern US. Senna leaves are a famously effective laxative. Plant prefers moist soils in the sun to part shade, and wake up late enough in the year to always surprise me when they flower. Nick seed and soak in water overnight, then sow warm, with germ in 1 to 6 weeks. Work up seedlings in successively larger pots until sufficiently sized to withstand the rigors of the landscape.



# Soursop . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . Annona muricata <<< NEW FOR 2017 >>>

Family: Custard Apple (Annonaceae)

Woody perennial tree to 13 feet native to the Caribbean and Central Americas. Protect from frost. The fruits are delicious—large, heavy, filled with juicily aromatic flesh that is sweetly acidic to the taste. In the tropics, I eat these over the sink! Soursop oil is pressed from the large, brown seeds. This is traditionally used as an antiasthmatic, antihypotensive and as a sedative. Nick seed, soak overnight and keep warm until germination, which occurs in 2 to 3 weeks.


