<p>Antigua and Barbuda</p> 	<p>Closed</p>	<p>The V.C. Bird International airport is closed to all incoming commercial traffic. <p>Aruba</p> 	<p>Closed to non-nationals</p>	<p>Effective April 19, 2020 (0:00 hrs UTC-4) up to and including May 31, 2020, it is prohibited to transport passengers by air to Aruba. Exemption hereto applies only to legal residents of Aruba on flights that are approved by the Department of Civil Aviation of Aruba. <p>Belize</p> 	<p>Closed</p>	<p>At present Belize's borders and the Philip S. W. Goldson International Airport are closed. Effective April 5th all borders were also closed to Belizean nationals seeking to enter the country. This decision was made by the Government of Belize, with unanimous support from the National Oversight Committee, to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Belizeans will only be allowed entry into the country if they are returning from seeking medical attention abroad or other emergency trips. This new measure will last for the duration of the national state of emergency.</p> <p>No restrictions have been placed on incoming or outgoing freight and cargo at the borders or at the Belize Seaports. <p>British Virgin Islands</p> 	<p>Closed</p>	<p>As of April 15, 2020 All borders to remain closed to visitors for another four months (whether nationals or non-nationals), except as preauthorized. Restrictions do not apply to freight, cargo or courier craft vessels. International crew will be required to remain within the airport and comply with all public health measures in effect.</p> <p>1 – To date, Phase One of the plan is endorsed which will take us up to June 1, 2020. This first phase only represents the internal reopening of the BVI. Please note that during this phase our borders will remain closed.</p> <p>2 – When the borders do open up in phase two, only persons deemed to belong to the Territory and persons with resident status will be allowed entry over the next three (3) months, but with strict conditions. At that time, such entry will only be allowed at the Terrance B. <p>Curaçao</p> 	<p>Closed</p>	<p>Effective Friday May 8, 2020 until further notice, the Government of Curaçao has decided to maintain the Curaçao International Airport closed for all inbound passengers from all countries, while relaxing the following measures:</p> <p>The only passengers who are exempted and allowed to travel to Curaçao (inbound) are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Curaçao residents approved by the Government of Curaçao.</li><li>2. Medical specialists and other medical personnel who are authorized by the Government of Curaçao.</li><li>3. Other persons specifically approved by the Government of Curaçao. For example:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Persons from Curaçao who are studying abroad and who are in dire circumstances.</li></ul></li></ol>


<p>Jamaica</p> 	<p>Airports: Closed</p> <p>Seaports: Closed</p>	<p>Jamaica's Prime Minister, the Most Hon Andrew Holness, has announced that the Jamaican borders will remain closed until May 31. This is subject to review. There will be a controlled re-entry of Jamaicans who have been stuck overseas. These persons will be required to make a special request in accordance with the established protocols which include agreement to be quarantined in a government facility for 14 days. <p>Martinique</p> 	<p>Closed</p>	<p><b>Airports:</b> In accordance to the French Government travel restrictions, Martinique International Airport is not allowing inbound flight (leisure, family visit etc..) to the Island. And as a further step to stop the spread of COVID-19, all international flights to/from Martinique are interrupted starting March 23rd, 2020.</p> <p>Air service will only be authorized for:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. The reunification of families with children or dependent person,</li><li>2. Professional obligations strictly necessary for the continuity of essential services,</li><li>3. Health requirements.</li></ol> <p>Flights from Martinique to France will be maintained until March 22, midnight; transport capacity will then be reduced to the same three criteria. The same regulations apply between the 5 French overseas</p>







		<p>Islands: Saint-Martin, Saint-Barth, Guadeloupe, French Guyana and Martinique.</p> <p><b>Cruise operations:</b> The Martinique Port Authority has stopped all cruise calls scheduled for the season. Requests for technical stops will be treated case by case. Passengers must provide the appropriate paperwork and supporting documents upon entry.
