

Most Commonly Used Resources for Veterans

Important: Remember to ask the veteran you are serving whether he/she is comfortable using a computer and the internet before you recommend resources to them.

For issues related to: VA Enrollment; Service-Connected Disabilities; VA Compensation; Needing military paperwork; Wanting to upgrade their discharge, call the VA-Accredited Veteran Service Officer nearest them. Financial Assistance

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Do they have 180 days of wartime service and an unforeseen situation that has caused a temporary financial emergency that a grant would resolve?

Are they a Post-9/11 Veteran?

Do they live in a county with Veterans Relief?

Are they a current or former Guardsman in need of \$500+ and can wait 4-6 weeks?
