All of the questions in the competition begin with the words "In which book..." The correct answer is always the title of the book. Students are encouraged to make note of the setting, main characters, and the main idea. One way to do this is to have an index card for each book.

Students can use the card as a bookmark and make notes as they read.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Lexile is a quantitative text-complexity metric. It does not always take into account content maturity or comprehension. Lexile simply measures the ability to read the individual words on a page.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> NC = Non-Conforming text. Great for high ability readers who still need age appropriate content

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> AD = Adult Directed text. Better when read aloud to a student rather than having the student read independently.
