Voting Assistance Hotline (833) 648-6837

Operated by the Michigan Voter Protection arm of the Michigan Democratic Party, this voting hotline does not push Democratic candidates. Rather, its mission is to insure all citizens are able to vote. Its volunteers can answer your questions. If unable to answer a question, they have direct access to paid personnel with more expert knowledge.

Reports one volunteer, "It's much more rewarding than texting or calling people to vote. Here, you're responding to phone calls and directly answering questions important to people."
