Community Organizing - a glimpse into the heart of the work

This fall, Sr. Maribeth Larkin, SSS, was interviewed by **Queensland Community Alliance** about her four decades of work as a community organizer. She and Joe Chrastil are the Regional Organizers for the **Industrial Areas Foundation (IAF) Northwest**, and provide direct support and training for the leaders and organizers of organizations partnering with IAF in Washington, Oregon, Canada, Australia and New Zealand. Sr. Maribeth's passion for community organizing sprung from her early work in the 1970s within the **Dolores Mission Parish** in East L.A., and the **United Neighborhoods Organization (UNO)**, and the incredible individuals and groups whose paths she crossed there.
