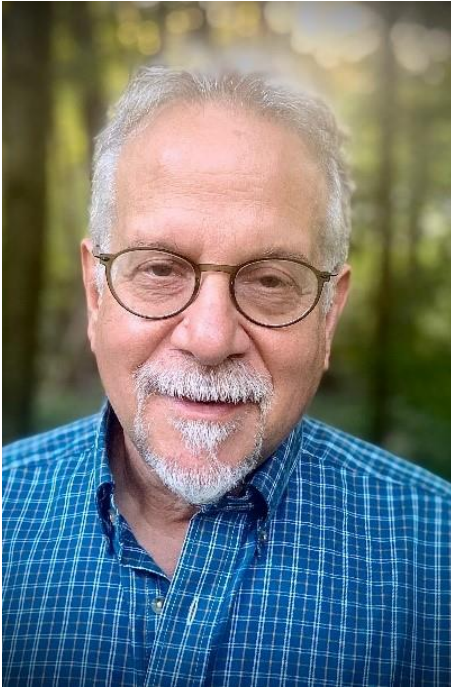


Baystate Pediatrician Recognized by Local Medical Society



Congratulations to **Dr. Matt Sadof**, Professor of Pediatrics at UMass Chan-Baystate and complex care physician in the division of General Pediatrics and Community Health at High Street Health Center! Dr. Sadof was honored on April 12 with the Community Clinician of 2022 award from the Hampden District Medical Society's annual meeting at the Storowton Tavern in West Springfield. The Community Clinician of the Year Award was established in 1998 by the Massachusetts Medical Society to recognize a physician from each of the society's 20 district medical societies who has made significant contributions to patients and the community and who stands out as a leading advocate and caregiver. The Hampden District Medical Society has >1,100 members who live and work throughout Hampden County. Dr. Sadof received his medical degree from the New Jersey Medical School of Rutgers University, his pediatric residency from New York Hospital and Cornell Medical Center and his fellowship in young adult medicine from Boston Children's Hospital. He joined the Baystate faculty in 1998. Early in his career he established a regional and state reputation in state-of-the-art asthma care, and then turned his focus to investigating best care practices for children with complex medical conditions. His work in this field has changed practice and improved the care of these vulnerable patients. He has published numerous articles and has held many leadership roles in national organizations, especially the Academic Pediatric Association and the AAP.
