IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW

Vendors

Arrival Time & Location: Please arrive no later than 7:00 AM using the **Quail Drive entrance**.

Parking: Park in the area designated for Vendors. Event staff will be on-site to guide you to your assigned vendor location.

FHFGBR Contact: Your main contact is **Sara Eldridge**, who will be wearing a purple hat to help you identify her easily.

Tent Setup: Please use **weights to secure your tent** — **stakes are not allowed** on Pennington grounds.

Tables & Chairs: Tables and chairs will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis. For your convenience, we recommend bringing your own table and chairs.

Coolers & Heating Equipment: You may bring small coolers. Grills and any heating elements are not permitted.

Rain Plan: In case of rain, vendor tables will be moved indoors.

Teams

Tent Space: Space for team tents is limited and available on a **first-come, first-served basis**. **Stakes are not allowed** on Pennington grounds — please **use weights to secure your tent**.

Coolers & Equipment:

Small coolers are allowed. **Grills, heating elements, and alcohol are strictly prohibited.**

What to Bring:

We recommend bringing your own outdoor chairs and/or blankets to enjoy the Family Fun Day activities comfortably.

Volunteers

Parking: Please park at the main entrance off Perkins Road.

Check-In Location: After parking, follow the signs to the Volunteer Check-In area, located near the Active for Autism (AFA) Registration tent.

What to Do at Check-In: Check in to receive your volunteer kit and further instructions.

Service Hour Forms: If you need verification for volunteer service hours, please bring your forms with you to the event.

IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW

AFA Participants



Arrival & Parking:

- Please enter Pennington via **Perkins Road** for race day access.
- Be aware that **5K participants will be running through the parking lot** — please drive cautiously.
- **Police Officers will be present to direct traffic** and help ensure the safety of all participants.



Runner Safety:

- For the safety and respect of the runners, **avoid the area near the finish line.**
- **Do not cross any barricaded areas** — these are in place to protect both runners and spectators.



Food, Drinks & Cleanliness:

- **Complimentary food and drinks** will be provided.
- Shaved ice will be available for purchase.
- You may bring **small coolers** with personal snacks or drinks.
- **Grills and other heating elements are not allowed.**
- **No alcohol is permitted** on the event grounds.
- Please use the **trash receptacles provided** to help keep the area clean.



Children & Lost and Found:

- **Children must be supervised at all times.**
- If a child is lost, **report immediately** to an officer or visit the **Information Booth** near Registration Tables.
- Lost children will be cared for and **reunited with guardians at the Information Booth.**



Pets & Animals:

- To maintain a safe and comfortable environment, we ask that **animals not be brought to the event.**
- **Service animals are allowed** in accordance with ADA guidelines.
- Please note: **emotional support animals, comfort animals, and therapy dogs are not considered service animals** under Title II and III of the ADA and should not attend.



Weather Policy: In the event of **rain**, both the **5K Run and the Fun Walk will continue** as scheduled.



Additional Information:

- Please note that there are **no ATMs on Pennington's grounds.**
- **FHFGBR staff and volunteers will be available** throughout the event — look for **badges** or visit the **Information Booth** if you have any questions or need assistance.

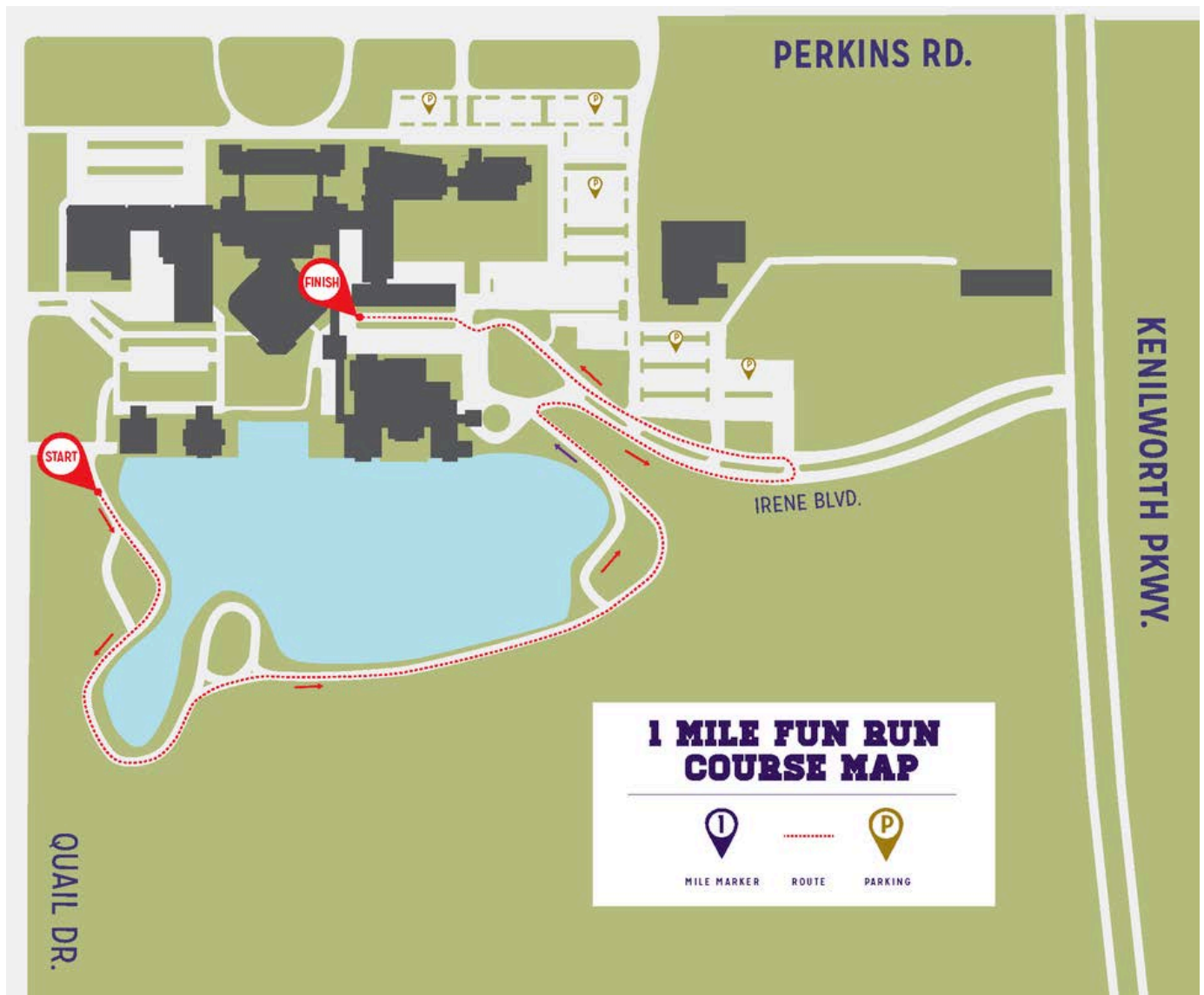
