# **Summer 2023: Upcoming Work**

#### **I-90 WORK AHEAD**


- Traffic will be shifted to the outside lanes through the work zone.
- Crews will begin building the new lanes on I-90 and bridges in the median.
- Two lanes will be open in each direction on I-90 with reduced shoulders.

#### **SELTICE WAY WORK AHEAD**

- Construction crews will rebuild Seltice Way east of the Huckleberry Thicket Shop to the I-90/SH-41 Interchange.
- Work will begin on the south side to rebuild Seltice Way and will be complete by late summer.
- One lane will be open in each direction.
- Business access will remain open.
- Bike and pedestrian detours will be in place.

#### WHAT TO EXPECT

- The speed limit will be lowered on I-90, SH-41 and Seltice Way.
- Intermittent lane restrictions will occur on I-90 and SH-41 at night.
  - Overnight work hours: 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. and 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. during special events.
  - Nighttime work will require lighting.
- Construction may be noisy and dusty.

## **2023 Construction**

The Idaho Transportation Department continues construction to replace and upgrade the I-90, State Highway 41 (SH-41) Interchange and the surrounding local roads. The second construction season includes:



Building three permanent bridges on I-90 for eastbound traffic.



Finishing one temporary bridge over SH-41 to maintain traffic flow during construction.
