HEARING HEALTH DECISIONS

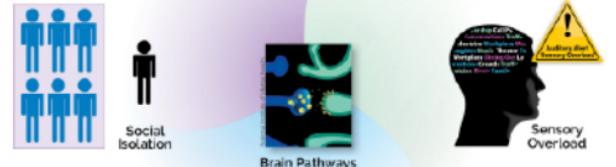
IN 2021, AN ESTIMATED **6.2 MILLION** AMERICANS AGE 65 AND OLDER WERE LIVING WITH **DEMENTIA**, GROWING TO **13.8 MILLION** BY 2050, BARRING THE DEVELOPMENT OF MEDICAL BREAKTHROUGHS.^[1]

DID YOU KNOW?

For those older than 60 years, the risk of dementia is closely related to the severity of hearing loss.^[2]

RESEARCH INDICATES

Hearing difficulty, social isolation and shared brain function pathways may require more cognitive resources be applied for hearing, reducing those available for working memory.

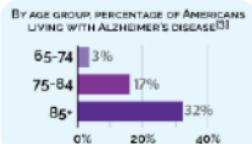

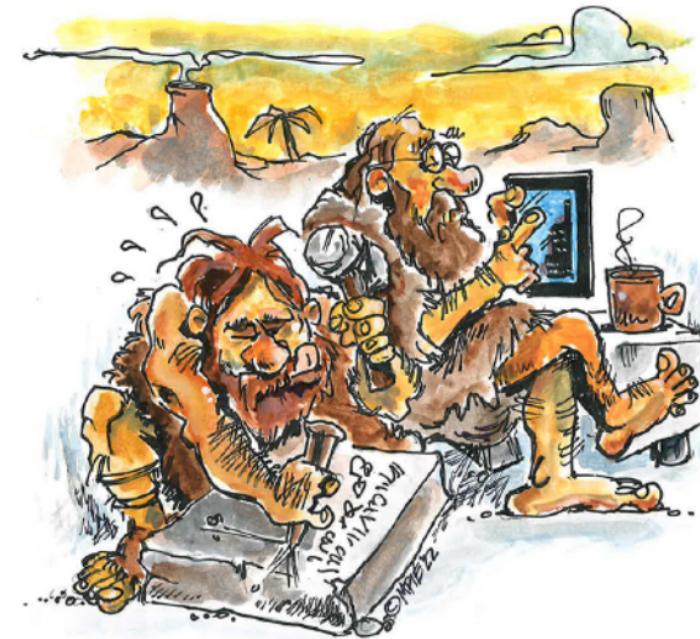
