

Three Valuable Reference Points:

1. People with either mild or moderate-severe hearing loss were more likely to discuss their hearing with their family doctor (43% and 50%, respectively), followed by an ENT, audiologist, and hearing instrument specialist (HIS).
2. The most important social network influence is the family doctor; in fact, 1 in 5 people (21%) indicated they would be highly motivated to get hearing aids if their family doctor recommended hearing aids. Only about 15% would be highly motivated if they thought their job performance suffered or if their **PHYSICIAN REFERRAL FORM** indicated they would benefit from hearing aids.
3. Ten medical conditions are associated with hearing loss. In fact, 1 in 5 people with hearing loss indicated they had one or more of these conditions. These conditions include: Dementia, Heart Disease, Diabetes, Ototoxicity, Kidney Disease, Risk of Falls, Depression, Aging, and Vision Loss.
