JOIN US

Join a community of 120 teachers from across the nation as a member of our first pilot cohort. Participate in a 12-week online course and offer feedback on our learning design, dialog with colleagues from various states, schools, grade levels, and content areas, and enjoy the support of a refugee educator facilitator/coach throughout the 2019-2020 school year.

COURSE TOPICS TO INCLUDE

- Understanding refugee resettlement and refugee educational experiences
- Culturally relevant, responsive, and sustaining pedagogies
- Social and emotional learning and trauma-informed practice
- Learning and instructional design
- Curriculum and assessment (including foundations in language learning)
- Advocacy and teacher leadership

AS A PARTICIPANT YOU WILL

- Develop your capacities to build safe, inclusive, productive learning environments to support refugee student academic achievement and well-being
- Participate in a diverse community of practice sharing resources and cultivating sustainable professional learning networks.
- Demonstrate your competencies through practice-based assessments, micro-credentialing, and an e-portfolio (optional)

LEARNING DESIGN

This pilot course is being developed using the Center for Learning in Practice's **Sustainable Learning Framework**. **Facilitation and coaching** will promote reflection, deep learning, and integration of theory, research, and practice. Diversity among participants will offer opportunities for **critical learning in dialog** and from a variety of perspectives.

COHORT #1 TIMELINE AND REQUIREMENTS

Course begins mid-July and runs through October, 2019. Coaching and community discussion will continue through March, 2020. Expect to spend 2-4 hours online per week. There will be job-embedded assignments to complete with immediate, practical application. There will also be discussions to join, formative assessments, and opportunities to earn micro-credentials through competency-based assessments.
