Since 1930, Forman has been a leader in the field of learning differences and a pioneer in innovative teaching, and it has been a joy to be part of this learning community. Forman's students and alumni are a testament to the strength of the school's programs and the quality of the teachers. I have cherished the opportunity to get to know so many of these wonderful students, past and present, and I will miss the daily conversations, athletic competitions, theatrical performances, and general opportunity to spend time with such an engaging and thoughtful group of individuals.

During my time at Forman, I have had the opportunity to work with many terrific members of the Board, dedicated administrators, and talented teachers. Working together, we have been able to grow the student body; expand the campus; build new spaces, including the Science Center and the Visual and Performing Arts Center; renovate and expand a dozen buildings, including the Malcolm G. At the school's last accreditation, the New England Association of Schools and Colleges commended Forman for achieving a level of success that was likely the highest point in the school's history. The tight-knit community at Forman is an especially strong and vibrant one, and we will always appreciate the connections and experiences we have had here.

I reflected on those goals recently and was gratified to see all that had been achieved. This confirmed my sense that it was time for the next phase of my life, confident that I had accomplished what I had set out to do. The Forman of today is in excellent shape, ready for the next stage in its history as it heads toward its centennial. I am also looking forward to my own next adventure, excited about new challenges and experiences.



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As I conclude my tenure at Forman, it is my goal to finish on a high note, and I hope to complete the work and support for a new Cognition and Learning Center and athletic turf field over the next 18 months.
