



Director of Neuroimaging Research Depression Clinical and Research Program

The Massachusetts General Hospital Department of Psychiatry is seeking an academic psychiatrist to serve as Director of Neuroimaging Research in the Depression Clinical and Research Program (DCRP).

The applicant will be expected to have a successful track record in neuroimaging of mood disorders as well as broad-based experience in the design and conduct of clinical trials for depression. The candidate must also have clinical expertise in the treatment of depression, as the position involves 20 hours/week of outpatient clinical work in the DCRP, including consultation and follow-up treatment of individuals with depression and related complex mood and anxiety disorders. In addition, the candidate should have demonstrated ability as a research mentor for junior faculty and trainees. The candidate must have a proven track record of external funding. Suitable candidates will have an MD or MD PhD, Board Certification in Psychiatry, and qualifications commensurate with appointment as Professor of Psychiatry at the Harvard Medical School.
