The Organization

The OSUCCC-James is the third-largest cancer hospital in the nation with a 356-bed adult patient-care component and a 36-bed BMT unit. The OSUCCC-James is one of the top cancer hospitals in the nation as ranked by U.S. News & World Report and has achieved Magnet® designation for quality patient care and professional nursing practice. At 21 floors with more than 1.1 million square feet, The OSUCCC-James is a new, transformational facility that fosters collaboration and integration of cancer research and clinical cancer care.

The Position

The Chief Nursing Officer (CNO) is responsible for the practice of nursing at the OSUCCC – James by ensuring consistency in the standard of nursing practice across the clinical settings. As a member of The James senior leadership team, the CNO supports and facilitates an interdisciplinary team approach to the overall delivery of care to patients, families, and the community. Direct oversight of all nursing practice within the cancer program, direct management responsibility for the associate chief nurse officers. Relationship-Based Care (RBC) is at the heart of what James nurses do every day. There are four relationships central to RBC; relationship with the patient and family, knowing and caring for ourselves, collaboration with our colleagues, and a strong commitment to the communities we serve.

The Community

Columbus is one of America's premier cities, a great place to move to, raise a family and explore. The cost of living in Columbus is 10 percent below the national average. Columbus is within 550 miles of nearly half the nation's population. Day trips abound and weekend getaways are easy.
