

New-York Presbyterian and Weill Cornell Medicine are conducting a search for the position of **Director, Center for Autism and the Developing Brain**. The position requires a PhD in clinical psychology or MD in Psychiatry.

In this role, the incoming Director will lead the collaborative clinical, research, and training program across NewYork-Presbyterian and the Departments of Psychiatry of Weill Cornell and Columbia University. This individual will be a visionary leader who will develop contemporary service delivery models, recruit and mentor program faculty and trainees, and grow and sustain relationships with community partners and philanthropists. He/she will provide direct clinical service (roughly 40% time) including clinical assessment and treatment of patients with ASD, as well as oversee clinical training within the center. Depending upon the interests and background of the successful candidate, the Director can also lead or participate in research, either independently or in partnership with current center faculty and the broader research communities at Weill Cornell and Columbia.

The Center for Autism and the Developing Brain is a collaborative program among NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital, Weill Cornell Medical College, and Columbia College of Physicians and Surgeons and in partnership with NEXT for Autism. The center provides comprehensive state-of-the-art psychological, medical and allied professional services in a single setting to address the needs of individuals living with autism spectrum disorders and other developmental disorders of the brain, at all life stages, along with their families. The center is located in White Plains, NY – at NewYork-Presbyterian/Westchester on a 214-acre campus in a state-of-the-art facility.
