[Marshall University's Joan C. Edwards School of Medicine](#) is a state-supported, community-based medical school established in 1977. The faculty and administration are committed to providing high quality medical education and residency training at a relatively modest cost. Clinical and basic research is focused on health issues related to rural populations, including obesity-related health disparities and addiction. The school's faculty practice plan, Marshall Health, employs approximately 1,150 individuals including physicians, residents, clinical, administrative and research staff; has upwards of 25 clinic locations and three multi-disciplinary facilities. The Department of Pediatrics saw more than 85,000 patients in 2017. The department is growing rapidly and the latest year continues the five year growth trend.

The Division of Neonatology is a region leading and highly productive NICU division with the physician staff near or exceeding the MGMA wRVU average. The division recently opened a

new 36-bed unit with 20 private family rooms and eight double rooms for twins. The division sees between 500-600 admissions per year. The Division currently has four boarded neonatologists and seven excellent neonatal nurse practitioners. All division physicians are full time faculty in the Department of Pediatrics at Marshall. The NICU is part of the [Hoops Family Children's Hospital](#) at [Cabell Huntington Hospital](#) consisting of the NICU, an 11 bed PICU and a 24-bed inpatient unit. Cabell Huntington Hospital has the largest and longest running NICU and one of only three Level III units in West Virginia providing emergency, critical, diagnostic, and therapeutic care for premature babies or those born with special needs.
