The Department of Pharmacology at the University of Texas Health Science Center San Antonio, dba as UT Health San Antonio (UTHSA) is a vibrant and collegial department that is seeking applications and nominations for Professor and Chair of the Department.

The Department of Pharmacology routinely ranks in the top 25 in Blue Ridge rankings and it has considerable strength in multiple areas of neuroscience research with a focus on the neuronal systems contributing to psychiatric diseases at behavioral, molecular and genetic levels. The faculty also have expertise in cancer drug discovery, aging, and metabolic diseases. Pain research and the intersection of neuroscience and cancer, is a new emphasis in the department. The faculty have close ties with their clinical colleagues in the Long School of Medicine to facilitate translational investigations.

The department is home for the Center for Biomedical Neuroscience (CBN) and the Addiction Research, Treatment & Training Center of Excellence (ARTT). The CBN serves to coordinate diverse neuroscience research and training across the institution. Each of these Centers has a T32 training grant, part of our robust training programs dedicated to training the next generation of biomedical scientists. The ARTT is a Center of Excellence dedicated to the promotion of addiction research, treatment, and training and facilitating the translation of discoveries in basic science to clinical care.

UTHSA is a comprehensive academic health university and research center in South Texas. One of six health institutions in The University of Texas System, UTHSA is the primary source of health professions, education and life sciences research in the region and is a major center for patient care. Reporting to the Dean, the Chair will provide vision, innovation and leadership to the Department. The Chair will work closely with the Department and School of Medicine, leadership, faculty and staff and is responsible for the Department's overall research, academic and administrative activities.

The ideal candidate will hold a terminal degree in biomedical sciences and possess a national reputation for scholarly activity and a continuous track record of funding, ideally with an NIH-funded research program. The Chair will possess excellent communication skills and have the ability to promote a culture of collaboration, innovation, and inclusion across the Health Science Center.
