The chancellor is the chief executive officer for the statewide UTHSC, which is headquartered in Memphis, and includes six of UT's doctoral-degree-granting health science colleges: Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy, Nursing, Graduate Health Sciences and Health Professions. The successful candidate will possess significant senior leadership experience gained through roles such as a dean, associate dean, chief executive officer, associate vice chancellor, chancellor or other substantive executive leadership role(s) in a major health science enterprise or institute that embraces clinical care, research and health science education.
