

Inaugural Executive Director, Cancer Network of West Michigan

Trinity Health and Michigan Medicine, in a new joint venture, have partnered to form the Cancer Network of West Michigan. They invite applications for the position of *Executive Director, Cancer Network of West Michigan*.

To better serve West Michigan, this new joint venture brings together the Lacks Cancer Center at Saint Mary's (Trinity Health in Grand Rapids), the Johnson Cancer Center at Mercy Hospital (Trinity Health in Muskegon) and Metro Health Hospital (Michigan Medicine in Grand Rapids) to form the *Cancer Network of West Michigan* (CNWM). The purpose of the CNWM is to enhance inpatient and outpatient services to the area as a single unified program; developing tumor site-specific multidisciplinary services; creating linkages and coordination with Michigan Medicine's Rogel Cancer Center for shared tumor boards and referral of complex cases; and increasing clinical trials activity, making new therapies available in a patient- and family-centered model to the people of West Michigan.

The ideal candidate will be an outstanding physician leader with a deep passion for providing, and commitment to, all aspects of patient-centered quality care and its cost-effective, optimal delivery. They will be a clinically skilled oncologist with the skills and experience to lead by influence in a complex provider environment. The Executive Director will have experience with the administration of oncology clinical trials, working in multidisciplinary tumor site-based teams, enhancing quality and safety in cancer care, and preparing for a more value-based health care environment. They must be comfortable working productively with hospital and group practice University based leadership, providing a trusted and compelling persona to the Western Michigan communities and have the ability to inspire potential donors. The Executive Director will be an employee and faculty member of the University of Michigan and report to the Operating Committee of the CNWM. The role of the Executive Director is to serve as a service line leader on behalf of the hospitals and university that constitute the members of the CNWM.

Qualified candidates are those who hold a medical degree or equivalent; board certification in medical, surgical, or radiation oncology or one of the surgical fields associated with oncology care, eligible for licensure in the state of Michigan and a faculty appointment at the Associate or Professor level in the University of Michigan School of Medicine.
