The Chair must possess an earned doctoral degree (PhD, MD, DrPH, or equivalents) that includes extensive doctoral-level training in the social, behavioral, or population sciences. The Chair will ideally have an appropriate record of scholarship, teaching, and service to meet the requirements for Full Professor (with tenure) at Brown University School of Public Health.
