MD Anderson Cancer Center (MDACC) is seeking applications and nominations for the position of Medical Director, Acute Care Programs and Clinic.

Known for world class care of cancer patients, MD Anderson specializes in the treatment of all forms of cancer with emphasis on rare and advanced disease. Many of the patients have significant comorbidities. The institution recognizes the need to develop a mechanism for the care of patients who while undergoing treatment have acute medical issues arise. MD Anderson is therefore going about a process to develop an acute care program and dedicated clinic with the idea of building the program in such a way as to also create a new academic discipline.

One of the primary objectives of the Acute Care Clinic is to reduce the burden on the Emergency Center by providing an alternative outlet to address patients with urgent medical issues that are adequately stable to receive clinical care in an outpatient setting. The Medical Director, Acute Care Program and Clinic will be responsible for developing and growing services for the new Acute Care Clinic. This position will work closely with Emergency Medicine to devise care pathways that route patients to appropriate services; acute ambulatory care or emergent care. The objective is to provide timely and appropriate care levels and optimal accessibility for patients.

Candidates are being sought at mid and advanced academic rank and will oversee the development and subsequent operation of the program and clinic.
