Division Director Pediatric Hematology/Oncology

The Division provides state-of-the-art patient care including pediatric oncology, nonmalignant pediatric hematology, hematopoietic stem cell transplantation and CAR-T cell services. The Division is an active member of the Children's Oncology Group and the Pediatric Transplantation and Cellular Therapy Consortium. Recent clinical research includes COG therapeutic studies, national consortium studies in pediatric thrombosis and in sickle cell disease, and investigator-initiated studies in allogeneic transplantation and in supportive care of cancer. Faculty in the division are active in extramurally supported research in hematopoiesis, in acute lymphoblastic leukemia and in cancer supportive care. The division has an ACGME approved fellowship program in pediatric hematology/oncology and in addition provides training for medical students, pediatric residents and internal medicine-pediatric residents. The Division has a close working relationship with the University's Wilmot Cancer Institute.

- An expert in the field of cancer, blood disorders, or blood and marrow transplantation who is also a physician leader with the creativity and drive to create and enhance world-class programs
- An inspirational leader who can artfully convey a long-term vision for patient-centered clinical care, medical education & training, quality & patient safety, and research, yet is equally skilled at operationalizing a detailed plan to achieve those goals; an "out-of-the box" thinker who is energetic but pragmatic and results-oriented

The successful candidate will have completed an ACGME accredited pediatric hematology/oncology fellowship and be eligible for an academic appointment at the rank of Professor or Associate Professor. The incoming Director will lead a pre-eminent team that includes regionally, nationally, and internationally recognized specialists in pediatric hematology, oncology, blood and marrow transplantation, surgical oncology, clinical investigation, data science, and fundamental science, among others.
