Associate Clinical Chief, Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology

The Dell Medical School at The University of Texas at Austin is seeking an exceptional clinical leader to join the Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology, Department of Internal Medicine, as the Associate Clinical Chief for Gastroenterology and Hepatology focusing on the developing robust clinical programs with our partner institutions, principally Ascension Seton.

Dell Medical School (DMS) is the first medical school established in nearly five decades by a member of the Association of American Universities, an organization of leading public and private research universities. As part of The University of Texas at Austin, one of the nation's leading research universities, the Dell Medical School's mission is to revolutionize how people get and stay healthy by educating leaders who transform health care, improving health in our community as a model for the nation and advancing high-value care.

The Department of Internal Medicine is home to 129 faculty and 68 residents per year. The Department is comprised of 11 Divisions and collaborates closely with other Departments in the School of Medicine and across the UT Austin Campus. We are partnered with a number of care delivery organizations in the Austin/Travis County community, including the Seton-Ascension system, Community Care (a large Federally Qualified Health Center network), and the Department of Veterans Affairs.


The Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology is a fast-growing division with 6 core faculty with specific interests in IBD, hepatology, motility and advanced endoscopy. The faculty are actively involved in clinical outcome research and furthering the Dell Med School's mission of high-value care. We are excited to expand our passion for teaching from medical students and residents to our inaugural gastroenterology fellowship program.

Ascension Seton (formerly Seton Healthcare Family), originally founded by the Daughters of Charity in Austin in 1902, is now the leading provider of healthcare services in Central Texas, serving an 11-county population of 1.9 million. The organization operates 5 major medical centers, 2 community hospitals, 3 rural hospitals, a mental health hospital, several rehabilitation centers, primary care and specialty clinics.

- Work with clinic management to gather and analyze data on clinical access, patient satisfaction, and referrals. Prepare action plans for deficits to expectations/goals.
- Develop relationships with referring providers to meet their expectations, promote the clinic and increase referrals.
- Assist in the strategic planning process for the division.
- Create a stellar teaching environment for trainees.
- Create a supportive environment for, and collaborate with, researchers.
- Provide direct care for digestive care patients.
