### **Director of the UVMCC and Division Chief for Hematology and Oncology**

**Burlington, VT --** The University of Vermont Cancer Center (UVMCC) and the Department of Medicine in The Robert Larner, M.D. College of Medicine (LCOM) at the University of Vermont (UVM), and the University of Vermont Medical Center (UVMHC), seek an outstanding physician/scientist with a record of significant contributions in academic hematology/oncology to serve as Director of the UVMCC and Division Chief for the Division of Hematology and Oncology. This individual will also hold the newly-established title of J. Walter Juckett Chair in Cancer Research. The new Director/Chief will join the College at an exciting time, with renewed commitment of resources to cancer prevention, care, and research. This is a unique opportunity for a highly-motivated medical hematologist-oncologist.

UVMCC includes 212 members (62 full, 96 associate, and 54 affiliate). UVMCC facilities encompass 16,609 square feet of total assignable space, including 11,335 square feet of dedicated lab space, 2,629 square feet of Clinical Trials Office space, and 2,645 square feet of administrative office space. The division includes 21 faculty, six advanced practice providers, and six fellows, all committed to excellence in clinical care, teaching, and research. Serving more than one million patients in Vermont and northern New York, this team of dedicated professionals provides comprehensive, multidisciplinary care to people affected by cancer and blood disorders in collaboration with radiation therapy, surgery, pathology and laboratory medicine, radiology, and a range of cancer support services.

Together, the LCOM and UVMHC comprise the only tertiary/quaternary academic medical center in Vermont; they offer state-of-the-art clinical, research, and educational facilities. UVMHC is part of the UVM Health Network, a six-hospital network established in 2011 that serves all of Vermont and the northern New York region. The LCOM, the nation's seventh oldest medical school, is widely recognized for innovation in education and research. The University campus, including the College and the Medical Center, is located on the shores of Lake Champlain between the Adirondack and Green Mountains in Burlington, Vermont, a vibrant community with year-round recreational opportunities that is frequently cited as one of the most livable cities in America.

As Director of the UVMCC, this individual will report to the Dean of the LCOM and has overall responsibility for the UVMCC. With strong leadership, there is opportunity for the UVMCC to achieve National Cancer Institute (NCI) designation within five years. As Chief of the Division of Hematology and Oncology, this individual will report to the Chair of Medicine and work in collaboration with the division chiefs of the Department's 13 other subspecialties. The Chief will oversee and further develop the Division's outstanding clinical service, educational, and research programs.

The ideal candidate will be a nationally-recognized physician leader and scholar in oncology and/or hematology, with a proven commitment to clinical care, medical education, training, and research. The candidate will be a board certified clinician with an established research program who brings a strong track record of leadership, securing extramural funding, and mentoring faculty at all stages of career development. It is expected that candidates will have credentials appropriate for an appointment at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor (tenure pathway) at UVM.

The University of Vermont is especially interested in candidates who can contribute to the diversity and inclusive excellence of the academic community through their teaching, service and research, scholarship, or creative arts. Applicants are required to submit a separate statement of advancing diversity and inclusive excellence.
