Doisy Research Center, which is an 8-floor research center with 80 laboratories.

Over 150 faculty support The Department of Pediatrics with 16 pediatric subspecialty services, 52 residents and 20 pediatric fellows. SSM Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital is a not-for-profit, leading academic medical center with a Level I Pediatric Trauma Center and Level IV NICU. Sitting adjacent to SLU School of Medicine, the 195-bed Magnet designated children's hospital is the main practice location for the Department of Pediatrics and is committed to improving the overall health of the pediatric population in the surrounding communities throughout St. Louis and Illinois region.

The successful candidate will be an accomplished academic leader in the field of pediatrics and have a track record of expanding clinical programs, recruiting and developing faculty, and focus in enhancing clinical research.
