

Houston, TX - The McGovern Medical School, a component of The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston (UTHealth Houston) is seeking a **Chief for the Division of Allergy and Immunology**. With resources to build and grow a newly formed Division, this is an exciting opportunity for an entrepreneurial academic leader with a passion for program development.

With nearly 1,000 medical students and a similar number of residents and fellows, McGovern Medical School is the ninth-largest and most diverse medical school in the country. The school is home to 23 basic science and clinical departments.

The Chief will have the opportunity to establish and grow a Division of Allergy and Immunology. The establishment and growth of this Division will be supported by strong institutional commitment and the collaborative environment within the Department and School. There are ample opportunities for collaboration with other divisions and departments including the Division of Pulmonary and Sleep Medicine and Rheumatology, as well as the Department of Pediatrics. The Division will have consulting inpatient services at Memorial Hermann Texas Medical Center. Outpatient services will be provided in the Texas Medical Center.

The primary clinical focus of the Division of Allergy and Immunology will be diagnosis and management of allergies, asthma, and immunodeficiencies. The Division Chief will lead the program within a dynamic and growing academic and clinical environment. Memorial Hermann Texas Medical Center serves as the tertiary referral center for other hospitals including those within the Memorial Hermann System. The McGovern Medical School also has an outstanding research environment including an NIH supported Center for Clinical and Translational Sciences program. Being situated in the Texas Medical Center (TMC) in Houston enables faculty in the Division to establish successful and productive collaborations with faculty in these TMC medical institutions, including Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences and MD Anderson Cancer Center.

The ideal candidate will bring the energy and vision for this new division, which includes starting a clinical service, establishing a research program and moving toward the establishment of a training program. An M.D. or equivalent medical degree, with Board Certification in Allergy and Immunology, a track record of cooperative leadership and the ability to further the research, scholarly and academic missions of the group is required. This new division could live in either the department of internal medicine or the department of pediatrics based on the background and vision of the chief.
