Based in New York City, NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital (NYPH) is a world-class academic medical center committed to excellence in patient care, research, education, and community service. NYPH is one of the nation's largest and most comprehensive hospitals and a leading provider of inpatient, ambulatory, and preventive care in all areas of medicine. With some 4,000 beds and more than 10,000 affiliated physicians and 50,000 employees, NewYork-Presbyterian sees more than 2 million visits annually, including close to 22,000

infant deliveries and more than 620,000 emergency department visits. NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital is ranked #1 in the New York metropolitan area by U.S. News and World Report and has repeatedly been named to the Honor Roll of "America's Best Hospitals."

With its dedicated staff, modern facilities, state-of-the-art technology, commitment to quality care, and role in educating future physicians, NYPH has a well-deserved reputation as a healthcare leader. Our medical groups in Brooklyn, Queens, Westchester and Hudson Valley increase access to a wide range of primary and specialty care services and include Weill Cornell Medicine and Columbia University Irving Medical Center physicians.

4. NewYork-Presbyterian Community and Population Health

NewYork-Presbyterian Community and Population Health, encompasses ambulatory care network sites and community health care initiatives, including NewYork Quality Care, the Accountable Care Organization jointly established by NewYork-Presbyterian, Weill Cornell Medicine, and Columbia University Vagelos College of Physicians and Surgeons.

NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center, affiliated with Weill Cornell Medicine, is among the foremost academic medical centers in the world with 862 beds providing emergency, primary, and specialty care in virtually every field of medicine. The center offers children and adults the latest diagnostic and treatment approaches. In partnership with the Weill Cornell Medical College we have built world class expertise in many key service lines including Neurosciences, Cardio-Vascular, Cancer care, Women's Health, Children's Services, and Transplantation. Some examples of these programs include Och Spine, a novel multi-disciplinary

and tripartite collaboration across Weill Cornell Medicine, Columbia Doctors, and NewYork Presbyterian. Other neuroscience programs of excellence include epilepsy, movement disorders, stroke and neurosurgery including oncology. Our cardiac services include one of the highest rated and busiest aortic surgery programs, as well as strong programs in structural heart disease, and cardiac imaging. The Kidney and Pancreas Transplant Program, which is the oldest kidney transplant program in New York State, one of the highest volume programs in the country, and nationally recognized for developing innovative strategies that allow for successful transplants. Our liver transplant program has pioneered robotic for donor surgery and recently performed the first totally robotic liver transplant recipient surgery in the northeast, and one of only 3 programs in the country to offer this approach. NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell is home to the William Randolph Hearst Burn Center — a world leader in burn treatment, rehabilitation, research, and education. The Alexandra Cohen Hospital for Women has the highest delivery volume in New York State, with class leading outcomes.

NewYork-Presbyterian Komansky Children's Hospital at NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center is part of our newly formed Childrens Hospital of New York and hosts a full-service, multidisciplinary pediatric program. Here highly skilled physicians, all of whom are affiliated with Weill Cornell Medicine, offer the full range of pediatric subspecialty care, including for respiratory conditions, cancer, and congenital heart disease through our Children's Heart Initiative, another tripartite program. The Center's Pediatric Emergency Department is a Level 1 Trauma Center and a New York City regional burn center.

Position Summary

The Chief Medical Officer of NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital/Weill Cornell Medical Center has oversight and leadership of quality and patient safety, medical affairs, care team model (advanced practice providers and partnership with GME on trainees), care managment, campus-based physician leadership and is a key partner for service line strategy and growth. The CMO will lead quality improvement efforts for NYP/Weill Cornell intending to acheive top clinical and patient-centered outcomes that set the standard in healthcare delivery and innovation. The CMO will also lead and coordinate state-of-the-art systems using analytics, informatics, and advanced techniques to support, develop, and deploy quality performance and process improvement methods. These approaches are designed to enhance NYP/Weill Cornell's goals to achieve and maintain the pinnacle of clinical quality and patient experience, reduce health costs and ensure equitable care delivery.

This position serves on the Senior Leadership Team of NYP/Weill Cornell and plays a crucial role in developing strategic initiatives and novel care delivery models. Leading with our NYP values of Respect, Integrity, Innovation, Teamwork and Empathy, the CMO will build strong bonds with the division chiefs, academic chairs, medical staff and oversee physician leadership (unit medical directors and quality chairs). The CMO will also participate in quality, informatics and medical staff/board meetings at NYP to ensure consistency and best practice identification. - Collaborates with clinical and operations leadership to actively manage financial performance and ensures the delivery of cost-effective and quality health care.
- Collaborates with human resources to ensure and maintain a positive work environment for all levels of staff.
- Uses analytics to understand utilization management and ensure processes are in place to meet and exceed organizational goals.
- Actively promotes a positive public image of NYP/Weill Cornell and is responsive to the needs and desires of various stakeholders.
- Develops and maintains positive working relationships with leadership across NYP and other critical local hospitals.

The CMO has a critical role to play in the ongoing evolution of the health system and will be a close partner to the COO in these efforts.
