

Section Chief, Hematology and Hematologic Malignancy

Dartmouth Cancer Center (DCC) invites applications and nominations for the position of **Section Chief, Hematology and Hematologic Malignancy.**

Founded in 1972 as the Norris Cotton Cancer Center and recently renamed as part of a 2022 rebranding, DCC is one of just 57 NCI-Designated Comprehensive Cancer Centers in the country. Under the leadership of its Director, Steven Leach, MD, DCC is recognized as one of the most distinguished cancer centers in the country, earning the prestigious Press Ganey Human Experience Pinnacle of Excellence Award in Patient Experience for its third consecutive year, and also ranking among the top ten NCI-Designated Cancer Centers in research innovation, as measured by the number of NCI-funded biotech startups. After providing excellent leadership for the past nine years, Dr. Christopher Lowry has stepped down and a national search is underway.

The next Section Chief will be a nationally prominent physician-scientist with a history of research funding. They will further enhance an environment that has a strong sense of community and collaboration, with over 261 active and ongoing research projects, led by 162 Cancer Center members, and supported by more than \$68M in annual grant funding annually from federal and other sources. The ideal candidate will partner with DCC's senior leadership in strategic pursuit of the next level of excellence and work to execute the Cancer Center's strategic goals. Development of a diverse workforce is a priority, and the new Section Chief will lead the recruitment of dedicated translational clinician scientists. Leadership and oversight for translational science, clinical research, and clinical operations to the Cancer Center, including the setting of aspirational goals, developing practical pathways to achievement, and meeting clinical and academic milestones are key responsibilities for the new Section Chief. Importantly, as the only FACT-accredited center for allogeneic and autologous bone marrow transplantation in northern New England, the Cancer Center is a leader in a regional care network serving patients from NH, VT, ME, MA and NY, and the ideal candidate will represent the Cancer Center in local, statewide, and regional collaborations. They will serve as the chief academic and administrative officer for the Section of Hematology and Hematologic Malignancy. They will ensure that research, education, clinical operations, and community outreach are aligned to support a demanding and high-quality academic practice. The Section Chief will identify and promote synergies within the Department of Medicine, DCC, the Medical School, and Dartmouth Health to further shared goals and support initiatives whenever possible.

Qualified candidates are those who hold a medical degree, MD or MD/PhD. Candidates must be board certified and eligible for licensure in the state of New Hampshire. Candidates must be eligible for a faculty appointment at the Associate Professor or Professor level in the Dartmouth Geisel School of Medicine.
