The Georgia Cancer Center at August University, in partnership with Korn Ferry, announces a national search for the **Program Director, Cancer Immunology, Inflammation & Tolerance**

The Georgia Cancer Center (GCC) at the Medical College of Georgia, Augusta University, brings together a team of basic science researchers, clinicians, radiation oncologists, nurse navigators, and patient support staff to create a community fostering innovation and care focused on improving the lives of its patients. As the cancer center for the only state medical school in Georgia, GCC is focused on a path of rapid growth and development, with the goal of achieving National Cancer Institute (NCI) designation. With strong state support – \$10M per year – it has been able to invest substantially in developing the physical structure of the Cancer Center and are now ready to invest in programmatic development.

A critical need for successfully stewarding and building upon this momentum is the recruitment of a dynamic leader, nationally recognized in their own active research area, to serve as the Program Director, Cancer Immunology, Inflammation & Tolerance. The successful candidate will have an exemplary record of research accomplishments with strong experience in coordinating and administering multidisciplinary programs. The Program Director will oversee all aspects of the Program, providing guidance for NCI-funded graduate education in tumor Cancer Immunology, Inflammation and Tolerance, and fostering research across a range of scientific fields within the Cancer Center. The Program's research endeavors are expected to extend through a spectrum of scientific fields relevant to tumor immunology and to include transdisciplinary collaborations across programs and departments at Georgia Cancer Center, along with other academic institutions.

The Cancer Center has recently completed a 80,562 square-foot expansion project that has not only added much-needed research and clinical space, but also provides a figurative and literal bridge between the Cancer Center's clinical and research missions. The \$62.5 million project includes a five-story addition to the existing research building and a three-story skyway, complete with offices and meeting space, to physically link the research and clinical facilities. The innovative design was created to foster further collaboration and communication
