Reporting to David McManus, MD, ScM, Professor and Chair of the Department of Medicine, the incoming Chief must be passionate about building collaborative clinical and educational programs of excellence, mentoring outstanding junior faculty, and establishing a pathway for increased development of scholarly work. UMass Chan, UMMH, and the Department of Medicine are committed to building a high performing Division of Hospital Medicine to train the next generation of leaders in the field of hospital medicine as well as elevate the standard of care for the acutely hospitalized patient.

About Hospital Medicine:

The UMMH Division of Hospital Medicine was founded in 1998 at the start of the Hospital Medicine movement. It is the largest Division within the Department of Medicine and includes over 90 faculty members and 30 advanced practice providers (nurse practitioners and physician assistants).

Hospital Medicine's research activities, led by Dr. Alok Kapoor, focus on outcomes research in acute care medicine and engage other divisions within the Department of Medicine and beyond.

Experience in career mentorship, fostering professional development, and guiding junior faculty to achieve their full potential is highly valued.
