On July 1, 2024, the R1 research institution of Old Dominion University and Eastern Virginia Medical School came together to form Macon & Joan Brock Virginia Health Sciences at Old Dominion University.

Ripe with opportunity to grow and expand clinical offerings, this role is ideal for an academic “builder”. The Division of General Internal Medicine currently consists of eight physician faculty and two advanced practice providers who practice outpatient, primary care. The Division is interested in developing further specialization and multi-disciplinary clinics, like the recently established Sentara-EVMS Comprehensive Sickle Cell Program which is led by a faculty member within this Division. As **Division Chief of General Internal Medicine**, the successful candidate will play a pivotal role in recruiting, developing, and managing a team of exceptional faculty members while driving clinical excellence and fulfilling the Division’s educational mission. The successful candidate may also be selected to hold the honor and title of the **Oscar E. Edwards Distinguished Professor of Internal Medicine**, an Endowed position within the Department.

Reporting to the Chair of the Department of Medicine at EVMS, the Division Chief of General Internal Medicine will be an accomplished physician, administrator, and inspirational leader who is prepared to devote this phase of their career to the advancement of the faculty, trainees, and the division. The successful candidate should possess academic credentials that qualify for appointment as Associate or Full Professor, have previous academic leadership experience, possess a commitment to scholarship and research, as well as demonstrate the ability to lead at strategic, tactical, and administrative levels, including experience managing space and financial resources.

Miles of waterfront, historical and cultural attractions, parks and outdoor recreation areas, lively nightlife, seasonal festivals, and family-friendly entertainment make it clear that there's something for everyone in Hampton Roads. Hampton Roads is the 33rd largest Metropolitan Statistical Area in the United States and eighth largest metro area in the Southeast. It is located 200 miles south of Washington, D.C., and 100 miles southeast of Richmond, the capital of Virginia.

Consistently earning high ranks in various "quality of life" surveys, the region offers an affordable cost of living and abounds in cultural, educational and economic opportunities. Seven colleges and universities, as well as two community-college systems, offer residents ample educational resources.
