The Ohio State University College of Medicine's Department of Neurology is seeking an exceptional academic physician-scholar with proven leadership skills to direct the Multiple Sclerosis Center and Clinical Neuroimmunology Program, an academic unit within The Department of Neurology. This is a full-time position, with rank and salary commensurate with education and experience. The successful candidate should be a nationally/internationally respected physician-investigator who has made a substantial impact on the field of Multiple Sclerosis. Demonstrated experience as a clinician and mentor is required.

The responsibilities of this committed leader include:

- Oversight and development of the administrative, clinical, and research operations of the Multiple Sclerosis Center and Program in Clinical Neuroimmunology;
- Stewardship of research, clinical, education, and development funds that are allocated to the MS Center;
- Establishment, in consultation with faculty members within the MS Center, of divisional priorities, standards, and practices;
- Implementation of policies and initiatives to enhance patient care and financially responsible interventions;
- Expansion of the MS clinical operation by enhancing patient volumes, safety, and quality care;
- Introduction and development of novel multidisciplinary and customized clinics in neuroimmunological diseases, including clinics focused on neurorheumatological disorders, neurological complications of immunotherapies, and fatigue/ sleep disorders in MS;
- Augmentation of MS clinical trial and translational research activities, with an emphasis on novel disease modifying therapies and investigator initiated studies;
- Application for grant funding to federal and non-profit organizations, and supervision of research in the area of MS and Clinical Neuroimmunology;
- Recruitment of outstanding MS clinicians and researchers to OSU;
- Mentorship of faculty throughout the division;
- Advancement of opportunities for faculty development;
- Promotion of the diverse gender, ethnic, racial, and socioeconomic faculty environment that exists within the division;
- Instruction of medical students, residents, and fellows about the pathogenesis, diagnosis and treatment of MS and other neuroinflammatory disorders;
- Participation in national research activities to promote the visibility and reputation of the MS Center, Department of Neurology, and The Ohio State University School of Medicine;
- Working closely with institutional development to foster the philanthropic endeavors of the Department of Neurology, and MS Center and Program in Neuroimmunology.

Qualifications for Director, Division of Multiple Sclerosis:

- Nationally or internationally renowned neurologist with substantive faculty academic experience and a track record of extramural funding and mentorship leading to trainees obtaining extramural funding as well.
- Completion of fellowship training in neuroimmunology.
- Board Certification in neurology.
- Strong track record of clinical operations leadership.
- Demonstrated leadership skills in building innovative programs as well as recruiting and retaining faculty.
- Prior demonstrated commitment to the recruitment, development, and retention of women, underserved minorities, and those with disability status.
- Eligibility for Ohio medical licensure required.
- National/international reputation in the field of MS/Neuroimmunology.
- Qualification for academic appointment at the associate professor or full professor rank; and,
- An active research program is desired but not required in basic, translational, clinical or health services research.
