Qualifications:

Applicants are required to be an RN and have a doctoral degree. While a PhD is strongly preferred, we would consider a DNP, EdD, or equivalent degree.

Other desired qualifications are as follows:

- Demonstrated success in an equivalent setting with related experiences that demonstrate leadership, management, and academic administration in a Department/School of Nursing level in progressively responsible positions, with experience at a level equivalent to department chair, associate dean, associate vice president, or vice president.

 with an academic rank at the full professor level. The ideal candidate must be tenured or
 eligible for tenure at the rank of full professor at Old Dominion University.
- An exceptional leadership record at a top-ranked School in a senior level administrative
 position with a demonstrated record of success in attracting, retaining, and developing
 outstanding, culturally diverse students, faculty, and staff.
- A national reputation as an outstanding educator/investigator/clinician in nursing.
 Documented capability and commitment to champion nursing research, education, and practice in an academic health sciences center.
- Outstanding interpersonal and communication skills, with demonstrated excellence in team building, change management, and supporting other leaders.
