Participates as a leader in the management of the clinical enterprise and demonstrates an understanding of the issues involved. Able to manage a complex organization with success measured in well-defined metrics. Work with leadership of the Columbia University Vagelos College of Physicians and Surgeons and the NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital to ensure excellent and appropriate care at all clinical and hospital sites.
