The Department of Pediatrics at the Yale School of Medicine is seeking an outstanding pediatrician to serve as the next Section Chief of Hematology-Oncology. - Assure and oversee the highest quality medical care to pediatric patients who are seen in the pediatric hematology-oncology outpatient clinics at any of the Yale-New Haven Children's Hospital locations
- Recruit and retain physicians, and cultivate existing and new programs of clinical care
- Responsible for the implementation of departmental activities to assure the delivery of clinical services in a manner consistent with the needs of the patients and the hospital
- Assure compliance with the YNHCH medical staff by-laws
- Maintain effective liaison with the chair and vice chairs of pediatrics at the Yale School of Medicine
- Ensure that members of the Section of Hematology-Oncology are active participants in advancing the overarching standards and initiatives of YNHCH
- Lead section faculty meetings, and participate in departmental leadership meetings

### Research and Scholarly Activities

- Dedicated time to an area of academic interest that will excel the career of the new Section Chief and also enrich the stature and expertise of the Department of Pediatrics
- Produce peer-reviewed scholarly works that are published and widely disseminated

### Clinical and Education

- Be a master clinician by providing both inpatient care at YNHCH and outpatient care at any of our clinic locations throughout Connecticut
- Be a visible and significant participant in the direct teaching of medical students, pediatric residents, and clinical fellows in pediatric hematology-oncology in a clinical setting

### Position Requirements

- Must have an M.D., M.D./Ph.D., DO, or foreign equivalent degree
- Board-certified in pediatrics and pediatric hematology-oncology
- Possession of or eligibility for a medical license and registration to prescribe controlled substances in the state of Connecticut
