This position offers an exciting leadership opportunity to head pediatric anesthesiology for one of the largest and foremost children's healthcare systems in the U.S.

The successful candidate will have a track record of clinical and academic leadership within leading academic institutions and complex pediatric hospital settings. MD or DO credentials from an accredited school of medicine, Board Certification in Pediatric Anesthesiology by the American Board of Anesthesiology, and eligibility for licensure in Georgia is required. Qualified candidates must possess academic accomplishments that merit appointment at the rank of Associate Professor or higher at Emory. An advanced degree is a plus.
