Tulane University School of Medicine (Tulane SOM) invites applications and nominations for the position of Section Chief of Cardiology.

The Section of Cardiology encompasses leading clinical, educational, and research programs for the prevention and treatment of cardiovascular diseases. It currently has 28 clinical and research faculty with anticipated growth through academic recruitments and community partnerships. The Section's nationally recognized clinical faculty members are dedicated to the education and training of physicians in cardiovascular diseases. The Section offers three fellowship programs: Cardiovascular Diseases; Interventional Cardiology; Cardiac Electrophysiology and offers diverse training at three affiliated hospitals, Tulane Medical Center, University Medical Center, and the VA Medical Center in New Orleans.

The Section Chief is responsible for the overall administrative, academic, and clinical operations of the division. The Section is poised for rapid growth and seeks an innovative and visionary leader who will work closely with the Chair of the Department of Medicine and the leadership of the Tulane SOM. Candidates must have experience in developing and leading clinical programs, a strong program in clinical or laboratory-based research, a record of innovative and effective administrative experience, excellent interpersonal and communication skills, and demonstrated commitment to promoting a diverse academic environment.
