

CHAIR OF PEDIATRICS

The Chair, Department of Pediatrics will be the academic, clinical, and administrative leader of the Department of Pediatrics at UT Health San Antonio Long School of Medicine. The Chair has responsibility for building a nationally leading program in children's health through the recruitment, retention and development to the current 106 full-time faculty (84 physicians and 22 advanced practice providers) with primary appointments in the Department of Pediatrics. The Chair of Pediatrics will lead and direct programmatic, clinical, research and educational development within the Department.

The following clinical divisions are included in the Department of Pediatrics at the Long School of Medicine: General Ambulatory Pediatrics; Pediatric Critical Care; Pediatric Cardiology; Pediatric Nephrology; Pediatric Endocrinology; Pediatric Gastroenterology; Pediatric Hematology/Oncology; Pediatric Nephrology; Pediatric Infectious Disease, Allergy & Immunology; Neonatology; Pediatric Hospital Medicine; Pediatric Pulmonary Medicine; and Child Abuse.

The Chair, Pediatrics has responsibility for aiding with the recruitment, retention and development of pediatric faculty with primary appointments in the Department of Pediatrics and in other departments that provide child health services. This includes but is not limited to pediatric surgery, pediatric orthopedic surgery, pediatric otolaryngology, congenital heart surgery and pediatric ophthalmology. The Chair is also responsible for providing effective mentoring, educational opportunities and professional development for all faculty within the Department.

One of the institution's visions for the Department of Pediatrics is to have it grow into a nationally-leading comprehensive children's clinical, research and training program. The Chair will work to enhance the research profile of the Department. This occurs in the course of faculty development and through the efforts of future recruitment of academic faculty. It is assumed that the Chair would have his/her own clinical and research interests. In addition, the Chair has ultimate responsibility for the organization, assessment, and accreditation of pediatric medical student clerkship and electives and a pediatric residency with 40 total residents.

Other strategic initiatives include increasing market share and revenue, increasing physician alignment, achieving excellence in quality and patient experience and enhancing workforce development and engagement.

The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio (dba: UT Health San Antonio), one of six health institutions in The University of Texas System, is the major source of health professions education and life sciences research in South Texas and is a major center for patient care in South Texas. UT Health San Antonio is a comprehensive academic health center with 3,250 students enrolled in five schools: the Joe R. and Teresa Lozano Long School of Medicine, the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, the School of Dentistry, the School of Nursing, and the School of Health Professions.
