Emory University School of Medicine located in Atlanta, GA is seeking nominations and applications for the position of *Director of Genitourinary Medical Oncology*.

The Division of Medical Oncology at Emory University School of Medicine is housed within the Department of Hematology and Medical Oncology. As part of Emory University School of Medicine and Winship Cancer Institute, the faculty in this Department are leaders in cancer research activity and provide the latest therapies for patient care. Winship physicians provide care through locations at Emory University Hospital, Emory University Hospital Midtown, Emory Saint Joseph's Hospital, Emory Johns Creek Hospital, and The Emory Clinic.

We are seeking an academic leader eligible for appointment at the associate or full professor level. Emory University Department of Hematology and Medical Oncology seeks an Oncologist who is actively involved in clinical and translational investigations, patient care, and education in the area of Genitourinary Medical Oncology. The successful candidate will have recognition and active involvement in national committees within GU Oncology. This role will have responsibility in the Division for leading the group, developing a clinical trials portfolio with a strong emphasis on investigator-initiated clinical research, collaborate with other specialties, participate in scientific programs of the Winship Cancer Institute, and teaching. We are seeking a collaborative leader who will work well with other specialties associated with the program.

Winship Cancer Institute is the clinical, education, and research base for Hematology and Medical Oncology at Emory University. It was founded in 1937 with a mission that no one need to leave Georgia for the best cancer care. Today, Winship sees more than 17,000 patients every year and is the only National Cancer Institute (NCI) designated comprehensive cancer center in Georgia. In 2016 Winship's faculty received over \$85 million in research funding, with \$38.6 million from the NCI. In 2017 Winship investigators conducted over 250 therapeutic clinical trials and enrolled more than 700 patients. It is the largest unit in Georgia for phase I clinical trials. The genitourinary group at Winship Cancer Institute works in a multidisciplinary model for research and clinical treatment of patients with urologic cancers. The group includes four (4) medical oncologists, community oncologists, radiation oncologists, pathologists, and urologists.
